Residency artists will be creating an immersive experience; you will be composing sounds and projections for the lobby and entry hallway as well as a sound composition that you will perform, live, in the actual performance space. Keep this in mind as you answer the question below.



Proposal Prompt:

If you could design any sound creation for performance at Audium, what would you do? What you envision can be based on something you've already composed, or something completely new. This is merely a proposal, not necessarily what you will actually end up creating during the residency. It is meant to get an idea of your creative process. Residency artists will be creating an immersive experience; please include ideas for lobby sounds and projections as well in your proposal. What themes will your composition explore? Who is your intended audience? If your proposal is based on a work you've already done, please include a link to a clip of the piece for our reference in the box provided. (5000 Character Limit)
